ACADEMICS

- Archer Street, Bayview Avenue, Columbus Avenue and New Visions schools had an exciting time celebrating the district's 100th day of school with a variety of creative and educational activities.
- Archer Street School kicked off its Read Across America celebration with its #Freeportreads assembly and revealed this year's theme of kindness. The week consisted of guest speakers from the school community including district administrators.
- The district hosted the Odyssey of the Mind Regional competition at the Caroline G. Atkinson Intermediate School for the fourth consecutive year. Students from different schools filled the building to compete in three different divisions and five different problems.
- The Honorable Joy Watson invited members of Dodd Middle School's peer mediation team on a tour of the Nassau County District Court in Hempstead. Sargent Joseph Dentici and Court Officer Christopher Martino spoke with students about the vital role of maintaining safety and explained the functions of the different courts, before taking the team to three different types of arraignment courts. Students learned about careers in the law profession including court clerks, translators, probation officers, district attorneys and legal aid attorneys.
- 103 Dodd Middle School students were inducted into the National Junior Honor Society. Inductees pledged to do their very best to uphold the five pillars, which include scholarship, leadership, citizenship, character and service.
- Freeport High School students welcomed Syosset High School students for the school's Breaking Borders gathering. Syosset students shadowed Freeport students through their assigned schedules by attending classes, socializing and taking part in the school's Therapy Dog program.

They also finished in seventh place at the UCA National Champions in the Co-Ed Game Day Division.
- Freeport High School student athlete Myles Norris captured the Nassau County Wrestling Championship title in the 285-pound Division. From there, he also took



second place in the New York State Championship in Albany. This is the second consecutive year that Myles has place second in the state championship.
