ATHLETICS

- The girls 4x2 relay team (Efe Omokeni, Enyero Omokeni, Nyah Porter and Alexandria Yarbrough) and Kevon O'Brien Smith 600-meter, set a school record and placed first at the New York State Indoor Track and Field championships. The boys 4x2 relay team (Trevon Campbell, Justin Lescouflair, Jahmel Maynor-Mendez and Kevon O'Brien Smith) and Jahmel Maynor-Mendez 300-meter, also set school records and placed third, and Efe Omokeni placed sixth in the long jump.
- Freeport High School student's Kevon O'Brien Smith, Enyero Omokeni, Jahmel Maynor-Mendez and Alexandria Yarbrough placed second in a 4x4 mixed relay at the indoor track nationals. By placing in the top six, the team achieved All-American status and were invited to the High School Hall of Fame Dinner.
- Freeport High School senior Lenox Pinczehelyi has made a commitment to Albright College to play lacrosse.
- For wrestling, Myles Norris placed second in his division and Lee Mauras placed sixth in his division at the New York State championship.
- The varsity cheerleaders placed ninth overall at nationals. It was the team's first appearance in the finals and best finish in school history. The team finished second at the Nassau County championship.
- The girls bowling team won its conference championship.
- The district congratulates coach Harry Mohrman, who was selected JV Basketball Coach of the Year in Conference AA1.
- The Board of Education recognized the outstanding efforts and accomplishments of student-athletes on the high school's varsity cheerleading team, girls and boys winter track team and the wrestling team during the April 10 Board meeting.
