 banquet at the Crest Hollow Country Club. This is the 12th time the Red Devils won
 the Rutgers Cup since 1937. Varsity Head Coach Russ Cellan was also awarded
 Coach of the Year.
- The Freeport Red Devils won the Conference 1 Nassau County championship against the Oceanside Sailors with a score of 42-0, and then went on to win the Long Island Conference I championship against William Floyd with a score of 20-19.
