ACADEMICS

- All three Atkinson teams that participated in the annual Odyssey of the Mind competition placed second, with the sixth-grade team qualifying to compete at the state tournament on April 2 at Binghamton University.
- Dodd hosted its Early College Awareness Week, designed to give students a head start on thinking about what colleges they would like to apply to and attend in the future, and what majors interest them most.
- Dodd hosted its National Junior Honor Society inductions on March 3.
- Archer, Giblyn and New Visions hosted Read Across America Day/Dr. Seuss Day by participating in a variety of literary activities with books by the iconic children's author. The day was designed to promote the importance of reading.
