# **ACADEMICS**

- The Freeport Educational Foundation raised more than \$35,000 at a gala with more than 350 attendees. The funds will be utilized to provide innovative educational opportunities to students attending the Freeport Public Schools.
- Dodd student Patricia Guerrero placed first in the design division of the Metric 500 Dragster Race.
- Freeport High School hosted the 11<sup>th</sup> annual Science Awards Ceremony on May 14.
   Students who excelled in science throughout the school year were honored, and students were also inducted to the state Science Honor Society. Winners of the Science and Engineering Fair were announced and awarded Mohdshobair Hussaini (first place), Luis Cardona (second place) and James Hastings (third place) and the high school's Robotics Club was recognized.
