- Maintains all current programs, services, and staffing.
- Supports programs to prepare students for college, career and life readiness.
- Maintains instructional technology and enhanced digital library (e-books and apps).
- Includes continued focus on STEAM initiatives.
- Includes continued support for health and safety of students and staff.
- Maintains support services for ENL students and students with special needs, including BOCES services.
- Includes after-school programs and clubs, including robotics.
- Supports capital improvement projects.

Financial Management

- The tax levy has been decreased for five consecutive years.
- The district's Standard & Poor's bond rating of AA is a rating earned by only a few of the 300 districts in New York State.
- Freeport spends approximately \$5,500 less per pupil and collects approximately \$10,700 less in tax levy per student than the average school district in Nassau County.
- By refinancing outstanding bond payments, the district saved taxpayers \$6.5 million in interest costs and also shortened the payback period by three years for one of the outstanding bond issuances.
- Through the first capital reserve fund established in 2009, as well as the second capital reserve fund established in 2017, the district has completed \$14.3 million in capital reserve projects at no additional cost to taxpayers.
- Using the interest-free Quality School Construction Bond program, the district completed \$5 million in additional capital improvement projects, saving taxpayers approximately \$1.4 million in interest costs.

Tax Levy History



- The Tax Levy Was Decreased for the Last Five Consecutive Years.
- The Proposed Tax Levy Increase of 2.92% Is Within the Allowable Tax Levy Cap.
 - Average Tax Levy Increase for the Past 13 Years Is Only 1.39%.
 - The District's Tax Levy Per Pupil Is Lower Than the Nassau County Average.
